The **REU Site in Raptor Research** is sponsored by the **National Science Foundation** and **Boise State University**. REU-Raptor Research is a 10-week undergraduate summer research program located in Boise, Idaho.

The goal of **REU-Raptor Research** is to engage undergraduates in mentored biological research with university faculty and other scientists using birds of prey (hawks, owls, falcons, vultures, and eagles) as model systems.

Eligible Students: U.S. citizens or permanent residents attending any college or university.

In addition to the mentored research experience, participants receive (1) \$6,250 stipend, (2) housing in a residence hall, (3) round-trip travel to Boise, (4) food supplement stipend, and (5) conference participation.

Tentative Program Dates: May 15 – July 21, 2023
